

Programs supported by the Rotary Club of Richmond, Inc.

FOUNDATION GIFTS PAID TO THE ROTARY FOUNDATION - \$1,700.00 - Gifts paid into the Club Treasury but intended as gifts to The Rotary Foundation, a parent organization

INTERNATIONAL PROJECTS

DG CANDY'S HAND PROJECT - \$863.00 - this program provided funding for the obtaining of prosthetic hands primarily for people in Third World countries.

INTERNATIONAL PROJECT #1, \$351.75 - This program provided limited funding for educational purposes for Rotarians visiting California from Mexico.

MOBILE EYE CLINIC - \$11,000.00 - This program involved matching grants locally, through the district and through Rotary International resulting in the purchase and shipping of a self-contained mobile eye clinic to Thailand.

ROTAVISION - \$1,350.00 - This program supports Rotarians and others in the field of ophthalmic surgery who travel to undeveloped countries and perform eye surgery, including cataract removal, and restore vision for persons who would otherwise never have the opportunity for such services.

ROTOPLAST - \$600.00 - This program supports Rotarians and others in the field of maxillary facial and plastic surgery who travel to undeveloped countries and perform surgery, to repair primarily cleft palates for persons who would otherwise never have the opportunity for such services.

RUSSIAN ARCHITECTS - \$7,230.97 - This program supported an exchange program wherein 12 Russian architects spent approximately three weeks in the US learning about current techniques in architecture, materials science, public buildings and related areas.

SANTA CATERINA CLINIC - \$3,435.00 - This program, in conjunction with Rotary International and Rotarians in Monterey, Mexico, outfitted a clinic for under served regions in rural Mexico.

LOCAL PROGRAMS

BAY AREA RESCUE MISSION - \$500.00 - This program provided support for a local provider of food and services to the homeless in the San Francisco Bay area, and primarily, at its shelter site in Richmond, California.

GRIP - \$1,200.00 - This program supported GRIP, the Greater Richmond Interfaith Program, which operates a shelter for women and families on 22nd Street in Richmond, California.

RICHMOND ART CENTER - \$1,550.00 - This program provided support for the Richmond Art Center in providing services for children and others at the Center, operated in part by the City of Richmond.

RICHMOND FOOD PANTRY - \$250.00 - This program provided support for the Richmond Food Pantry, a supplier of food to families living at or below the poverty level.

RPD-YMCA XMAS PROGRAM - \$500.00 - This program, operated in conjunction with the YMCA and the Richmond Police Department, funding a holiday party for poor and under served children in the Richmond community.

SALVATION ARMY - \$500.00 - This program supported the Salvation Army in providing services to the poor, particularly children.

YMCA - \$2,500.00 - This program provided support for the YMCA/Coronado youth center, which provides recreational and educational opportunities for children living in the "Iron Triangle" area of Richmond, an area that experiences significant levels of youth violence and poverty.

MASQUERS PLAYHOUSE - \$554.00 - This program provided support for a local community theater group

SCHOOLS

CAMP ROYAL-CAMP VENTURE - \$675.00 - this program supported a youth leadership camp program for poor and working class children

OTHER SCHOOLS

ADAMS - \$750.00 - This program provided support to a local Jr. High School's "Escape Club" which provided local travel, art and cultural experiences for poor and working class children.

ENGLISH LEARNERS - \$300.00 - This program in part a program to assist immigrant, non-English speakers to transition into English speakers, and was operated in conjunction with the West Contra Costa Unified School District.

KENNEDY KING SCHOLARSHIP - \$8,000.00 - this program, operated in conjunction with Contra Costa College, provided one full scholarship for a young person to attend college.

VERDE - \$400.00 - This program funded a holiday party for children at Verde Elementary School in North Richmond, California. North Richmond is an area of exceptionally high crime and poverty.

TOTAL OTHER SCHOOLS 9,450.00

PERES - The Richmond Rotary Club provides substantial support to Peres Elementary School, located in the Iron Triangle area of Richmond. The Club's commitment to Peres goes back approximately eight years and the Club has provided substantial support for this school over those years.

CLASSROOM SPONSORS - \$2,400.00 - This program provided \$100 to each classroom teacher for the purchase of supplies and materials for direct use in the classroom.

SPIRIT OF EXCELLENCE PROGRAM - \$1,711.64 - This program provides incentives for children to excel and achieve through good attendance, conduct and advancement toward specified educational goals.

WALKER CREEK - Walker Creek Camp, operated by the Marin County Office of Education, provides a reward of a one-week camp adventure for children who have satisfied the requirements of the Spirit of Excellence program.

BUS EXPENSE - \$670.93 - transportation to and from the camp.

CAMP COSTS - \$4,834.00 - Cost for attendance at the camp for students qualifying.

Other PROGRAM FUNDING

PERES - \$779.64 - Miscellaneous supplies and services incidental to the Club's involvement in supporting Peres Elementary School, including providing transportation for students to and from the Lawrence Hall of Science on the campus of UC Berkeley and providing a pool of funds to assist needy students in obtaining the required uniforms as instituted by the West Contra Costa Unified School District Board.

TOTAL PERES \$10,396.21

SCHOLARSHIP - \$1,500.00 - This program awarded three \$500 scholarships to deserving students for college. Students were selected based on meeting graduation and essay criteria.

TOTAL SCHOOLS \$22,021.21

TECH CENTER - \$6,687.50 - This program, operated in conjunction with the Rotary Club of El Sobrante, Salesian High School, the YMCA and Opportunity West, provided educational opportunities through a computer-based reading improvement program. Preliminary results indicate that each student who completed the program improved his or her reading level two full grades.
